Computer Source

Computer Source offers the latest information and current trends in computer science and technology. The indexed publications cover topics in such fields as programming, software, artificial intelligence, robotics, hi-tech products and much more. Nearly 450 periodical titles are indexed, with over 300 including full-text content. Full-text content dates as far back as 1985.

Computer Source indexes both general and scholarly titles, ranging from *PC Magazine*, *Fast Company* and *Macworld* to *Neural Computation* and *International Journal of Systems Science*.

Looking for information on the new video iPod from *Macworld* magazine? Insert "video iPod" in the search box. Users may specify publications by inserting the journal title in the "Refine Search" area. This search finds articles, such as "Video iPod Arrives" from the *Macworld* December 2005 issue. The results are listed chronologically, in descending order. It lists the total number of "hits" for each search. New articles are added daily.

Various "limiters" and "expanders" can specify such factors as article publication date, length of articles, cover stories, presence of images, document type, as well as document fields (subject terms, geographic terms, author, article title, etc.). Search "hits" may be sorted by date, source, author or relevance. The "document type" pull-down menu limits searches by category. These categories include: bibliography, book review, editorial, interview, letter, obituary, product review and speech.

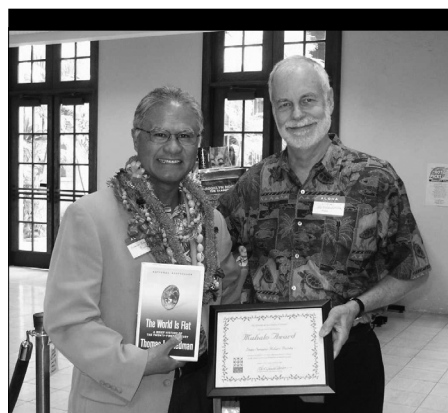
Searching for product evaluations on laptop computers? The advanced search button allows users to specify the type of article, such as case study, interview, speech or editorial. Type in "laptop computers" in the search box and choose "product review" from the "Document Type" pull-down menu. This search finds

articles, such as "Latest Luxury Laptops Storm into Contention" from the January 2006 issue of *PC World*.

Want to save your searches or articles for later? Sign in under "My EBSCOhost" and you can store items in folders for a future session.

Copy Charge to Increase Mar. 1

As a service to library customers, the Friends of the Library of Hawai'i provide leased copiers in all public libraries. The current charge is 15 cents per copy.

Effective Wednesday, Mar. 1, 2006, the price of a single copy will increase from 15 to 20 cents. The last copy price increase occurred in September 1998, when the price was raised from 10 cents to 15 cents.

Need State and Federal Tax Forms?

With 2006 tax season underway, you'll be glad to know that all 51 public libraries will once again serve as distribution outlets for State tax forms. This public service was made possible by a continuing partnership between the Hawai'i State Public Library System and the State Dept. of Taxation.

Library staff will supply the forms, but are not trained to assist with tax questions. For help, call the Dept. of Taxation's Tax Information Line: on O'ahu, 587-4242; from Neighbor Islands, call toll-free at 1-800-222-3229; for the hearing impaired: on O'ahu, call 587-1418; from Neighbor Islands, call toll-free at 1-800-887-8974. For more information, visit the State Dept. of Taxation website: www.state.hi.us/tax.

Do you need Federal tax forms? There are 33 public libraries that will serve as distribution outlets for Federal tax forms: O'ahu - 'Aiea, Hawai'i Kai, Hawai'i State Library-Federal Documents Section; Kahuku, Kailua, Kaimukī, Kalihi-Pālana, Kāne'ohe, Kapolei, Liliha, Mānoa, McCully-Mo'ili'ili, Pearl City, Salt Lake-Moanalua, Wahiawā, Waialua, and Waimānalo; Maui - Kahului, Kīhei, Lahaina, Makawao, and Wailuku; Lāna'i - Lāna'i; Kaua'i - Hanapēpē, Kōloa, and Waimea; Big Island - Bond Memorial, Hilo, Honoka'a, Kailua-Kona, Kealahou, Nā'ālehu, and Pāhala.

In addition, you can log-on to the Federal IRS website to print or download forms: www.irs.ustreas.gov/forms-pubs/index.html. Then go to: forms and publications by date or by number. The website also includes other Federal tax information.

HSPLS Receives \$92,200 in Tax Refund Donations

Act 193 (HB 638) provides a check-off box on State individual income tax returns which allows taxpayers an opportunity to support the Hawai'i State Public Library System. All you need to do is mark the appropriate check-off box on your 2005 State Individual Income Tax Return Form: Form N-11, line 43b; Form N-12, line 58b; Form N-13, line 24b; and Form N-15, line 60b. You'll be so glad you did!

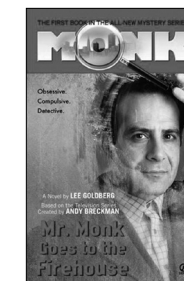

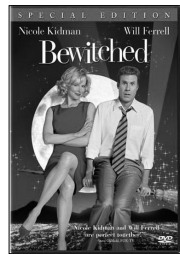

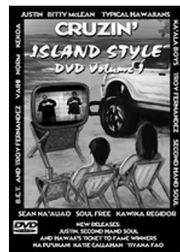
BEWITCHED

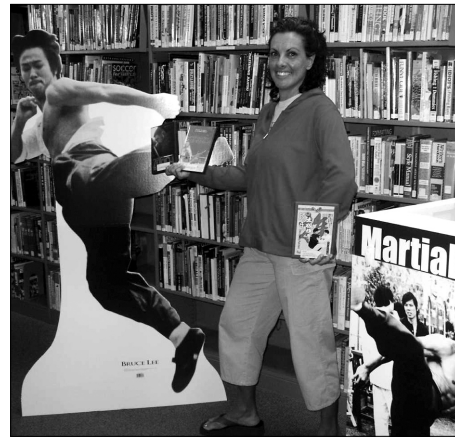


New Martial Arts Collection to Open at Salt Lake-Moanalua Library

Calling all martial artists! On Friday, Feb. 10, the Salt Lake-Moanalua Public Library will debut a new special collection of martial arts books and DVDs.

The 300-title DVD collection features instructional videos from Aikido to Zhaobao Taiji Boxing and most styles in between, including the major karate styles of Goju, Shotokan, Kyokushin, and Wado, as well as the major kung fu styles of Hung Gar, Shaolin, Hsing-I, Taiji (Sun, Chen, Wu, Yang), White Crane and Wing Chun. Current popular forms of jiu jitsu such as Gracie, Small Circle and Brazilian are also featured, along with Kendo, weapons systems and the lesser known styles of Capoeira, Cai Li Fo, Kali and Silat.

Tae Kwon Do and other Korean arts are represented, as are the mixed martial

arts, including UFC, ADCC, Superbrawl and Shootboxing. Additionally, the collection contains classic Chinese kung fu and Japanese samurai cinema with titles featuring Bruce Lee, Toshiro Mifune, the Zatoichi series and films directed by Akira Kurosawa.

A comprehensive martial arts book collection of 330 titles complements this special DVD collection. Library customers are welcome to borrow these books or DVDs (\$1 fee for each DVD borrowed with a 7-day loan period).

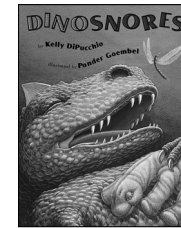

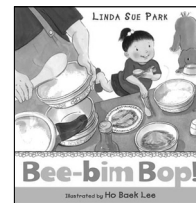
Kelly DiPucchio DINOSNORES

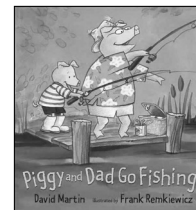
Linda Sue Park BEE-BIM BOP!

A little girl helps her mother to shop, prepare and cook her favorite Korean dinner meal. The recipe is included at the end of the story.



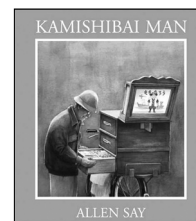
David Martin PIGGY AND DAD GO FISHING

Update: ADA Renovations

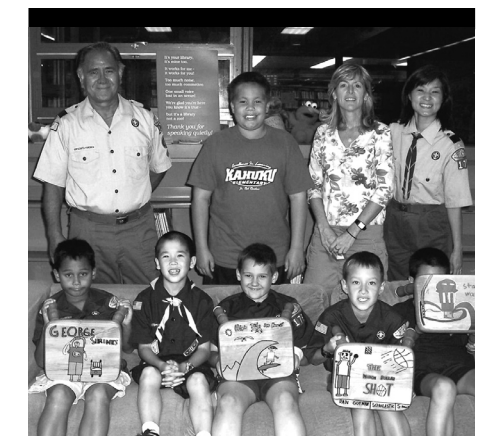
- **Kea'au Public & School Library** (Big Island) – reopened 1/23/06 with full library services restored. Closed since 10/10/05 for a major air-conditioning and duct work system replacement project.
- **Mānoa Public Library** – reopened 1/30/06 after being closed since December 2005 for construction of a wheelchair-accessible ramp, wheelchair-accessible parking, and installation of a fire alarm system. Temporary limited parking in parking lot while painters added parking stripes to new handicapped-accessible stall. In addition, front entrance closed temporarily while repairs to the stairs are completed.

- **Kalihi-Pālana Public Library** – reopened 1/17/06 with the addition of Saturday hours to its public service schedule. Closed from 12/19/05 for handicapped-accessibility upgrades to its parking lot and rest rooms.
- **Hawai'i Kai Public Library** – book drop and customer parking lot are now open after being closed 12/22/05 – 1/1/06 for paving of handicapped-accessible parking stall.
