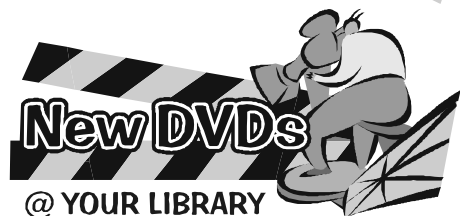

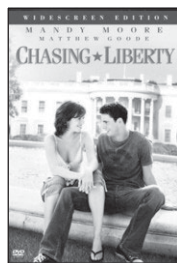

Nation's Largest Used Book Sale Coming July 10-17

Why do book lovers from all over the world come to Hawai'i each summer? To attend the largest used book sale in the United States!

The 57th annual Friends of the Library of Hawai'i Book Sale will be held from July 10 through 17 at McKinley High School Cafeteria. This year, the Friends are celebrating 125 years of service to Hawai'i's people.



Bibliophiles of all ages can choose from a wide variety of over 150,000 assorted books, paperbacks, magazines, CDs, DVDs, videos, encyclopedias, special "collector" items, and more. This year's collection of cookbooks and computer books is outstanding. Sale proceeds will directly benefit the Hawai'i State Public Library System. Book sale funds provide branch libraries and staff with books and equipment, performance programs, and continuing education grants.

In 2003, the book sale provided more than \$120,000 to the 50 public libraries to fund equipment, books and programs. Since 1952, the Friends have distributed over \$5 million to the Hawai'i State Public Library System.

The Friends of the Library of Hawai'i, a tax exempt, nonprofit organization, help to recycle books to readers of all ages in an effort to promote the joys of reading and life-long learning. The Friends promote and support public libraries.

Book sale hours are: 10 a.m.-9 p.m., July 10-16; and from 9 a.m.-2 p.m. on July 17. There will be special discount days starting July 12: *Fiction & Record Day*, *Senior Discount Day*, *Member's Discount Day*, *Library Card Day*, *Half Price Day*, and *Fifty Cents Day*. Three Libraries Change Schedules

Three Neighbor Island public libraries have changed their public service hours, effective July 1: **Bond Memorial Public Library** (Big Island), **Kōloa Public & School Library** (Kaua'i), and **Moloka'i Public Library**.

- Bond has added three more hours on Fridays, closing at 4 p.m. instead of at 1 p.m.
- Moloka'i has added one hour each on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, opening an hour earlier at 9 a.m. On Mondays and Wednesdays, it will open at noon, 30 minutes earlier than before.
- Kōloa Library will open a half hour later on Thursdays, at 9 a.m., to allow for weekly staff meetings.

New library hours signs are posted in the three libraries, and bookmarks with the new hours will be available at all libraries on the appropriate islands.

Spotlight on: Business, Science and Technology Section Hawai'i State Library

Located on the mauka end of the second floor, the Business, Science and Technology (BST) Section consists of more than 80,000 books. The circulating collection is located on the 'ewa side of the room and the Diamond Head side houses the reference collection.

Among the topics in the three major subject areas include:

BUSINESS: investing (stocks and mutual funds), national and international company information (*Dun & Bradstreet Million Dollar Directory*, *Mergent* (formerly *Moody's*) and *Standard and Poor's* directories), franchises, manufacturers' directories, advertising, real estate, marketing, personnel management, public relations, insurance, venture capital, and nonprofit organizations.

SCIENCE (the pure sciences): mathematics, chemistry, physics, meteorology, biology, zoology, astronomy, botany, genetics, computer science, geology, "how to do" science projects, evolution, paleontology, history of the sciences, and famous scientists.

TECHNOLOGY (the applied sciences): cooking, automobile repair (*Chilton's Repair Manuals*), *Kelley Blue Book* (new and used car values), electronics, medicine, health information, prescription drugs (*Physicians Desk Reference*), engineering, agriculture, construction, plumbing, manufacturing, woodworking, gardening, diet plans, and diseases.

Special collections, such as: telephone directories for major U.S. cities, schematics for television sets, corporate annual reports, and mail order catalogs are a part of the section. A display case highlighting a special topic each month and a variety of business related bibliographies, such as *Web Design*, *Small Business Start-Ups*, *Retirement*, and *Supervisory Skills*, can be found in this section.

A few selected investment journals, such as the *MorningStar*, *Standard & Poor's Outlook*, *TrendLine*, and *ValueLine*, are located at our reference desk.

Research health and medical-related topics by using the Consumer Health Information Service (CHIS) computer, donated by the Hawai'i Medical Library.

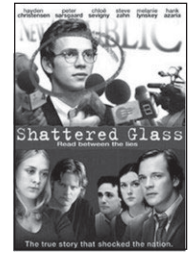
