HELP WITH VACCINATIONS

Need help getting a COVID-19 vaccination? Currently, everyone aged 12 and older is eligible. And vaccinations are free regardless of your health insurance status. There are many places on Oahu to get vaccinated: Longs Drugs, Walmart, Sam's Club, Costco, Walgreens, Safeway, Times, Foodland, Kaiser Permanente, Queen's Health System, Hawaii Pacific Health, and Castle Hospital. Or you can use the CDC Vaccine Finder by texting your ZIP code to 438829. Need help registering for an appointment? If you are age 65 or older, call 2-1-1 to schedule an appointment over the phone and to access transportation services to and from your vaccine appointment.

WANTED: UNUSED PLAYERS AND CARTRIDGES

If you have a Digital Talking Book Player that is no longer being used, please send it back to the library so it can be used by another patron. It's easy to return. Just place it in its original box and give it to your USPS mail carrier. Please contact us if you need a new box. If you have any old audiobook cartridges that you may have forgotten to return, please send those back to the library as well. ACCESS FOR PEOPLE WITH READING DISABILITIES

The National Library Service for the Blind and Print Disabled (NLS) recently made it easier for people with reading disabilities to enroll. The change allows reading specialists, educators, librarians and school psychologists to certify the

eligibility of applicants with reading disabilities like dyslexia. Previously, only doctors of medicine could certify this type of application, creating added difficulty for some applicants and barriers to access. NLS consulted with consumer groups and took the necessary steps to have Congress amend the eligibility language.
