### Literacy Tips

### Additional Activity

#### Paper Plate Mobile

You can reuse your paper plate puppets to create a mobile! Using a paper plate, cut a spiral shape beginning from the outer edge of the plate. Make a small hole in the center of the plate attach a piece of string. On the bottom of the spiral portions, glue the small cutouts. Let dry & hang up!
