
### 2023 Rainbow List for Children

E Dapier, Ages 3-4 Picture Book, Fiction



E Macias, Ages 3-5 Picture Book, Fiction


Teo must decide between silver pants or a tutu for his big dance recital.

Love is powerful but not always easy to describe. This picture book shows diverse families expressing the many reasons they love each other.




### Wild, Charlotte Sullivan and Charlene Chau (illustrator) Love, Violet



If You're a Kid Like Gavin



Learn about Cleve Jones and his creation of the AIDS Memorial Quilt in 1987.


