GREETINGS FROM LBPD-HONOLULU

Aloha Kākou Dear Readers,

Happy New Year! As we start 2026 there are new and exciting opportunities coming your way from LBPD to read, learn, and connect. Foremost, this year marks the library's 95th anniversary of service and there will be plenty of occasions to celebrate the milestone. We'll have special events at the library including the Louis Braille birthday celebration and a "season of braille" which will include the Braille Challenge. We are looking forward to several other reading challenges including one for school kids during the Winter Olympics, and then for everyone during the traditional summer period with a food-based theme this year. We're also anticipating more kanikapila-style events and celebration of the musical talents of our LBPD family of readers. For those interested in getting more comfortable with assistive technology there will be weekly sessions in the library. It is our intent to continue to work with partner organizations and the extended LBPD 'ohana to work on providing in-person opportunities on neighbor islands as well. In a more traditional role the library is working to expand the scope of the collection to ensure patrons have access to the materials they want, including materials that may not be in English. If there are particular books or topics in which you have an interest, please let library staff know. For each of us it is so important to stay informed and stay connected, and the library is here to help each of us do that. HAWAI'I LBPD UPDATE

- Feedback: Hawaii LBPD is blessed with a pool of wonderful volunteers that help us in many ways including with recording books, and also reading stories and announcements for the radio reading service. Often these volunteers ask library staff for feedback about their recordings, in particular from our listeners and readers. While library staff is able to provide technical feedback, the narrators are interested in end user comments. If you do have feedback about any locally produced recordings at LBPD please contact the library either by phone or email and let us know your thoughts. We can then share them with our volunteers.
- Tech Skills: Do you have questions about how to use accessible tech on your phone, computer, or other device? Perhaps you want to learn about using screen readers? The Digital Navigator partnership between the Hawai'i State Public Library System and Mapunawai has come to LBPD. You can now sign up for sessions at the library for a designated one hour time period and get your questions answered. Reservations are required and can be made either by calling the library or through the Mapunawai website at: <https://book.mapunawai.com/lbpd> For neighbor island residents, stay tuned for more information about LBPD-linked digital navigator opportunities in the coming months.
- Dungeons & Dragons: The D&D program continues with the next gathering at LBPD on Friday, January 16 at 11:00 am through 3:00 pm. In 2025 the participants had some great fun during these sessions. As a reminder, each event is limited to a single day, so there is no concern about missing out on a previous event. No previous experience is required. Give the library a call for more information.
- Braille Events: Keep your calendars open for Friday, January 30, 2026 for the Louis Braille Birthday Party at LBPD, 10:00 am to 1:00 pm. That will also serve as the kickoff for the Braille Challenge 2026 season for students learning braille. While the Braille Challenge is geared for school students through Grade 12,

all aspiring braille readers can participate in this Season of Braille in the January-March timeframe by making use of LBPD resources or taking advantage of the NLS Braille on Demand program. Give LBPD a call if you'd like to more about these opportunities.

- Winter Reading Challenge 2026: Read for the Gold! For students in grades K-12 during this year's Winter Olympic Games in Italy you will have the chance to participate in a special reading challenge right here at home. Make sure to check in with LBPD before the games start, and then read, read, read during the period of February 6-12! It is sure to be lots of fun!
- LBPD Book Club: The monthly meetings resume on February 7 at 1:00 pm after our short break for the New Year. As a reminder, the theme for the February meeting is “romance,” and just in time for Valentines Day! Hope you can join us for the fun at the library.
- ‘Ōlelo Hawai‘i Book Narrators Needed: The library is moving ahead with efforts to start recording books in Hawaiian and other Pacific languages. If you know of anyone that might be a good candidate to help us in this important effort please get in contact with us at the library.
- Public Outreach: If you have suggestions for outreach or guest speaking opportunities for LBPD staff, please let us know and we will follow up with you. We need help in getting the word out about our library services.
