

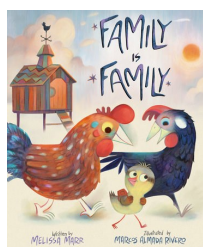

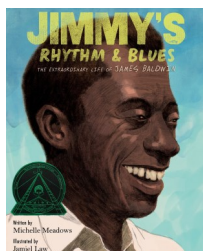
# Top Ten Rainbow List for Children

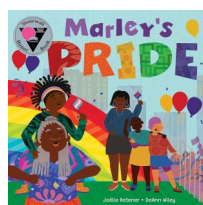

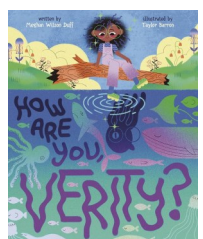
Marr, Melissa and Rivero, Marcos Almada Rivero (illustrator)
